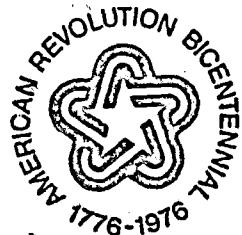

BUREAU OF THE CENSUS

Each year or so you receive background data and a preliminary funding entitlement estimate from the Office of Revenue Sharing under the Federal general revenue sharing program. The background information contained on the notification is collected and compiled by the Bureau of the Census and provided to the Office of Revenue Sharing for use in the fund allocation process. Once you have received the information, a specified period of time is available to you in which to review the individual data elements and advise the Office of Revenue Sharing if you have questions concerning them.

Although the period of time for review provided by the Office of Revenue Sharing remains unchanged from previous years, the Bureau of the Census this year is planning to initiate more direct contact with you prior to the publication of the estimates, and before the release of the information to the Office of Revenue Sharing. Currently, the early contact will be restricted to population. The intent is to better assure accurate population figures and generally to improve the production, review, and release of the population data. The purpose of this communication is to mention the change in our release plans and to alert you to expect the population figures from us in January 1978. Along with the population estimate will come other material relating to the population figure to assist in the review process.

Your involvement and assistance early in the review operation with us is central to an adequate data base for the general revenue sharing program. It should also foster a more complete understanding of all information relating to the population figures both by us as the agency responsible for providing data for use in general revenue sharing and by you as a recipient of revenue sharing funds. Thank you in advance for your help.

In accordance with West Virginia Code Section 11-13-21, I am pleased to enclose a check which represents your municipality's share of coal severance taxes collected and restricted for distribution to counties and municipalities. These taxes were collected on production of coal from July 1, 1977 through September 30, 1977.

Twenty-five percent of coal severance taxes is deposited in the "all counties and municipalities revenue fund" by the State Tax Commissioner. (Quarterly distribution of these collections is made to counties and municipalities.) Monies are first allocated among counties based on each county's relative percentage of the State's population as determined by the most recent decennial census (1970). Each county's share is then distributed to municipalities based on each municipality's share of the county's population as determined by the most recent decennial census (1970). The amount remaining represents a share determined by the population of unincorporated areas. The Code specifies that this amount shall be paid to the county.

The Code specifies that counties and municipalities shall create "coal severance tax revenue funds" which shall be the depositories for tax distribution receipts. Monies in such funds may be expended by county commissioners or governing bodies of municipalities for such purposes that shall be determined to be in the best interests of the people of the respective county or municipality.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

In an attempt to simplify the billing procedure for services rendered by our audit staff, we are converting our billing basis from a daily rate to an hourly rate. In doing this you will be billed only for actual hours worked by the auditor(s). This means that lunch breaks, travel time and any other absenteeism from the audit sight that is not related to the completion of the audit requirements will not be billed.

As of April 23, 1979, the \$125.00 per day rate will be discontinued and future charges will be computed on an hourly basis.. At that time our rate will be broken down according to an auditor's experience, knowledge and overall ability to perform the audit function.

(The charge for an experienced auditor, one who is capable of performing his duties on his own without constant supervision and guidance, will be \$21.00 per hour. The rate for an inexperienced auditor, or an "auditor in training," will be \$14.00 per hour. This rate will remain in effect until June 30, 1979.)

As you are aware of, the Tax Commissioner is ex officio the Chief Inspector and Supervisor of Public Offices. In this connection, Tax Department examiners are assigned to conduct post audits and examinations of every city, county, school board and magistrate.

Our charge covers not only our field auditors but their transportation, meals, materials, supervision, office and clerical personnel and all other supplies and materials necessary to perform the services required. The Legislature appropriates no State funds for this audit function. Due to the increased costs of meeting these needs we are forced to increase our hourly rate beginning July 1, 1979.

(As of July 1, 1979, the charge for an experienced auditor will be \$25.00 per hour. The rate for an "auditor in training," will be \$16.00 per hour. As is required by Statute, any municipality having a total income of under \$2,000.00 from all tax sources will continue to be audited for a flat charge of \$60.00)

In an effort to expedite and control proper posting for our accounts receivable, I ask that you be sure and return a copy of the invoice along with your payment.

This new hourly procedure and breakdown of auditor rates have come as a combined result of input from some governmental officials and what we, as the Tax Department, feel is a fair and reasonable procedure.

These new rates are calculated to meet the audit cost requirements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1980. Our financial situation will again be analyzed in February, 1980 so as to notify you in March of any adjustment necessary for audit costs for the fiscal year 1980-81.

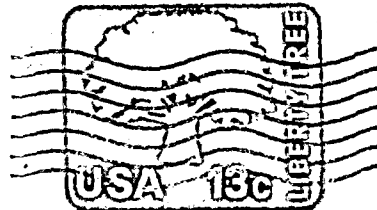

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I refer you to my July 11, 1975 letter and enclosures relating to the publication of year-end financial statements.

I have recently become aware that Note 2 of that letter is in error in defining a Class I legal advertisement. Note 2 of that letter should read as follows:

Note 2 - Financial statements of municipalities with more than 2,000 population must be published as a Class I legal advertisement in compliance with the provisions of Code §59-3-1. A Class I legal advertisement as defined in Code §59-3-2 is one which "shall be published one time in a qualified newspaper published in the publication area". The publication area for such publication shall be the municipality.

As you have probably noted, Note 2 of my July 11, 1975 letter defines a Class I legal advertisement as one which shall be published one time in two qualified newspapers of opposite politics. If the June 30, 1975 financial statement for your particular municipality has already been published in two qualified newspapers of opposite politics, I see absolutely no need for any corrective action. However, if such publication has not been accomplished at this time, please be reminded that it is only required that such statement be published one time in one qualified newspaper published in the publication area.

I sincerely regret any inconvenience you may have experienced regarding this matter.

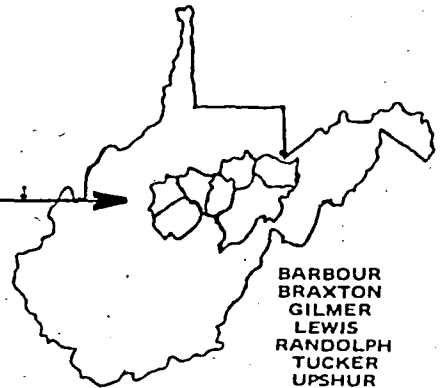

STREET LIGHTING AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into as of the 1st day of April,
1974, by and between MONONGAHELA POWER COMPANY, an Ohio corporation, of Fairmont,
West Virginia (hereinafter called "Company"), and the TOWN OF FLATWOODS
_____ (hereinafter called "Municipality");

W I T N E S S E T H:

THAT, for mutual valuable consideration, it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. The Company agrees to provide and maintain an outdoor street lighting system for the public streets, bridges and public places within the Municipality consisting of standard overhead street lamps of such types and at such locations as the Municipality, by its duly authorized representative, may from time to time request, as shown on "Exhibit A", attached hereto as a part hereof, as the same may be amended from time to time. Said lamps, and all poles, lines and other facilities used in connection therewith, shall be owned and maintained by the Company.

2. The Company shall undertake, through its general electric distribution system, to cause all of said lamps to be lighted during hours of darkness, and for such purpose it may use such lighting systems, including types of lamps, as it may from time to time deem desirable. Upon receipt by the Company of written notice from the Municipality, by its duly authorized representative, reporting a lighting failure of any lamp installed hereunder, the Company shall promptly, during normal working hours, restore such lamp to lighting service.

3. The Municipality hereby grants to the Company such licenses and easements upon and over streets, alleys, bridges and public places of the Municipality as may be necessary for the erection, installation, maintenance, alteration, repair or removal by the Company hereunder of said lamps and facilities.

4. All sidewalks, pavements and other surfaces owned by the Municipality which may be damaged by the Company, in its performance of this Agreement shall be restored by the Company to as good condition as existed immediately prior to the occurrence of such damage.

5. If the Municipality requests the installation or relocation of any lamp which requires the addition of any poles or lines and appurtenances thereto, the cost of such addition as determined by the Company shall be borne by the Municipality, except that where such addition extends along a street or alley of the Municipality which the Company expects to use as a part of its electric distribution system, the Company shall bear the cost of installing one pole and not to exceed 200 feet of the line required therefor. However, during any twelve-month period the Company shall not be obligated, at its expense, to (a) install more than one additional pole for each 250 lamps or fraction thereof installed in the Municipality at the beginning of such period, (b) make more than one relocation for each 250 lamps or fraction thereof installed in the Municipality at the beginning of such period, (c) install more than six additional poles nor (d) make more than six relocations. The Company shall have the right to use any additions or relocation as part of its electric distribution system.

If the Municipality requests relocation of a lamp and/or facilities previously relocated by the Company at the request of the Municipality, the cost of such relocation shall be borne by the Municipality. The cost of any relocation of special facilities described in Paragraph 6(b) hereof shall be borne by the Municipality.

6.(a) The rates for the standard incandescent lighting hereinabove provided for shall be the rates set forth in "Schedule OSL" attached hereto as a part hereof, as such rates may be amended from time to time as authorized by the Public

Service Commission of West Virginia. If the Municipality desires installation of a mercury vapor street lighting system, or any part thereof, the rates therefor shall be the rates set forth in "Schedule IV" attached hereto as a part hereof, as such rates may be so amended from time to time.

(b) If the Municipality desires an installation or relocation of a street lighting system, or any part thereof, requiring special facilities different from the types provided for in Paragraphs 1 or 6 hereof, such as an underground or ornamental system, the rates therefor shall be determined by an addition to the applicable standard rates of an amount which will compensate the Company for its additional investment so required, and the rates so determined shall also be shown on said "Exhibit A" as so amended from time to time. In the event a change in the Company's said standard rates is authorized by said Public Service Commission, the standard rate portion of the rate for each lamp (exclusive of its pole) theretofore charged pursuant to this subparagraph (b) shall be changed correspondingly.

The Company shall each month render to the Municipality a bill for the lighting provided hereunder during the immediately preceding month, including any costs incurred by the Company during such preceding month which are chargeable to the Municipality under the provisions of Paragraph 5 hereof. The Municipality shall take and pay for the lighting herein provided for in accordance with said rates and in accordance with the Company's "Rules and Regulations for Electric Service" as from time to time on file with the Public Service Commission of West Virginia.

7. The Municipality agrees that during the term of this Agreement it will provide in its annual budgets, estimates and levies of taxes for funds sufficient to pay bills rendered by the Company hereunder. If the Municipality shall default in the payment of any bills rendered hereunder, the Company may at its

option, after having given the Municipality ten days' prior written notice of the Company's intention to suspend service hereunder, discontinue the service herein contracted for and continue to withhold the furnishing of such service until the Municipality has paid all bills so in arrears. Any such suspension of service by the Company shall not terminate this Agreement unless the Company so elects.

8. This Agreement shall become effective with respect to service rendered on and after 4-6, 1974, and shall continue in effect for a term of ten years, and thereafter for successive terms of five years each, until terminated by either party by the giving of written notice to such effect to the other party not less than six months prior to the expiration of the initial term or any renewal term hereof.

9. This Agreement terminates and supersedes all prior agreements between the parties hereto providing for the furnishing and installation of street lighting service as described herein.

10. If, because of price control laws, regulations, executive orders or other legal restrictions of the United States government, the full amount of the rates provided for herein cannot legally be collected as of the effective date hereof, the Company may collect instead that portion of said rates which it is legally permitted to do and may restructure said rate schedule so as to obtain as nearly as practicable, at the earliest time and in the most satisfactory manner consistent with such laws, regulations, orders and restrictions, the full revenue increase granted herein. The Municipality will forthwith approve and adopt any such rate restructuring by the Company within such limitations so long as the same is not arbitrary or unreasonable, and the Municipality will cooperate with the Company in obtaining any necessary approvals from the United States government or subdivisions thereof.

11. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the parties hereto and their respective successors and/or assigns.
