The Flatwoods Town Council met in regular session on July 17, 1989 at 7:30 in the Community Building.

The Mayor called the business meeting to order, followed by the swearing-in ceremony.

#### Old business

Mrs Shoult has already given consent to trim, although no one has requested permission from Mrs. Brown. The Council approved the Mayor's permission to obtain consent from Michael Davis concerning the trimming of the bush on her corner lot if he deemed it necessary.

After looking at town signs, the Council determined the location for the erection of the new town signs.

#### New business

After discussion, a motion was made by Scott Gibson and seconded by Harold McCune to give the new Treasurer, Sue Mayhew, authority to withdraw funds from the State Investment Fund if possible.

On a motion made by Harold McInne and seconded by Virginia Brown, the Council approved the purchase of a new recorder's book and stamps.

Also the Council approved the revision of the town budget and authorized the recorder to fix her signature to the "Request for Revision to Approved Budget" to be mailed to the State Tax Commission for approval. The revisions are as follows: (1) The unencumbered balance of the General Fund was reduced from \$3500 to \$1732 with the decrease of \$1818 coming from the following: reduction of city hall outlay from \$4000 to \$3200 and street contracted from \$1140 to \$322.00. (2) Local Insurance unencumbered balance increased from \$2510. to \$2886 with the \$376 being added to street fund, the only category budgeted with the fund.

In final action, Scott Gibson was appointed by the mayor as street Commissioner. He was given permission to check with the State Road Commission concerning the needs for a state coat on Corp. Rd.

2) After discussion introduced by the mayor, Harold McLean moved and Scott Gibson seconded to begin a petition for the reduction of the speed limit to 35 mph. between the northern end of Titusville Corporation and Jerry Banta Home, US Route 19 & State St 4. Such action was the earlier clause of Troop J.W. Morris, who agreed to send signed petitions with a cover letter of his own to the proper authorities. Motion carried.

3) In other action, the Council voted unanimously to authorize the Mayor to contact J.W. Morris to head a town meeting concerning a Crime Watch project. This was on a motion made by Scott Gibson, seconded by Virginia Brown.

4) In final action, the following motion was introduced by Virginia Brown and seconded by Harold McLean: to enter an ordinance that there shall be no loitering in and front of or around private businesses, public buildings, or vacant houses after business hours, or on the street within the Corporation after 11:00 p.m. Motion carried.

2) Trick or Treat tradition will be observed between the hours of 6:00 - 9:00 P.M. on Saturday, Oct. 28. The recorder volunteered to post an announcement in the P.O. window, and the treasurer was volunteered to see that it was announced in the Flatwoods Elementary school.

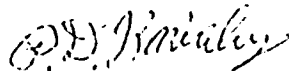

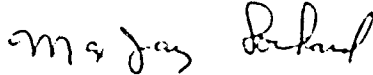

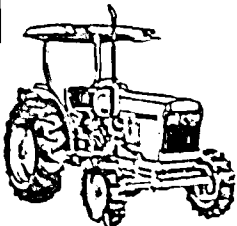
I have been unable to attend the meetings of the Town of Flatwoods, due to the long hours I have to devote to my business.

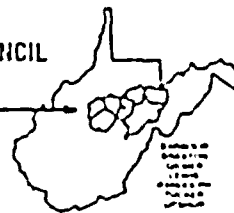

Thank you for submitting the Small Cities Block Grant application seeking \$750,000 from the 1993 program for the wastewater collection system project.

I regret to inform you that we are unable to accommodate the request from the 1993 allocation. As in past years, the demand for funding has far exceeded the amount of funds available. This year 153 requests for funding were received totaling \$76.7 million, all competing for the \$14.7 million available for new projects.

Funding decisions are always very difficult, and this year is no exception. We have determined that while there is a local need for your project, funds are just not available to accommodate it this year. Counties and municipalities will be provided with an opportunity to participate in the development of the 1994 SCBG program design. We would expect to conduct public meetings concerning the program sometime early in 1994.

After the 1994 application guidelines and procedures are finalized, requests for assistance may again be submitted in accordance with the 1994 program design. We understand the need and will work with you during the coming year in this regard.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### A. Purpose

Dunn Engineers, Inc. (Engineer), under contract with the Town of Flatwoods (Town), has prepared and submitted to the Division of Environmental Protection (DEP), a Facilities Plan Report (Report). The Report presents evaluations of alternative methods of constructing a wastewater collection system to serve the Town. It also recommends the most economical and feasible alternative; estimates project costs; and estimated customer rates.

### B. Activities Summary

Field counts of the potential number of users were made and water consumption records from the Flatwoods-Canoe Run Public Service District (PSD) were analyzed to determine the approximate size of the components of the Project. The components were plotted on enlargements of U.S. Coastal Geodetic Maps of the Town.

Other data collected and analyzed included population statistics, Braxton County Health Department recommendations; and future growth potential.

Agencies concerned with environmental and historical concerns were contacted to ascertain the presence, or the lack of the presence, of natural resources that might have an adverse effect on the construction of the planning, design and construction of the Project.

The results of the field surveys and data collected formed the basis for the conclusions reached, and recommendations made, in the Report on the most economical and feasible method of constructing the Project.

### C. Conclusions

Based on the analysis of the results of field surveys and existing data collected, the following major conclusions were made:

- The existing methods of collecting and treating sewage (on-site systems) pose a general health hazard to the Town, its citizens and the surrounding, downstream areas.

- It is feasible to construct a wastewater collection system in the Town of Flatwoods within the current rate structure of the Flatwoods-Canoe Run Public Service District who will become the owners and operators of the system.

### D. Recommendations

The following major actions were recommended in the Report:

- A new gravity collection system be constructed with flows in a generally northerly direction, with the prevailing grades.

- Pump stations and force mains be constructed to transport the sewage, in a generally southerly direction to a manhole on the Sutton Lane Project, presently under construction. This manhole is approximately 400 feet south of the Town boundary.

## HISTORY

The Town of Flatwoods has recognized that the lack of a public wastewater collection system is one of the causes of the decline in its growth and the continued use of on-site wastewater disposal systems poses a threat to the health of its citizens. In an effort to correct this situation, the Town has applied for financial assistance in the form of a Small Cities Block Grant. This has occurred twice - - once in 1993 and again in 1994. The latest application process is combined with the preparation of a Facilities Plan and cooperation with the Flatwoods-Canoe Run Public Service District, who have applied for financial assistance for the Project, from the Farmers Home Administration.

The latest occurrence that may have an effect on this Project is the Weyerhaeuser Company's plan to construct a wood plant approximately 2.5 miles north of Flatwoods. Sewer service to that plant is tentatively scheduled to be connected to this Project, thus increasing the chances for approval of financial assistance.

This Public Meeting is the next step in the regulatory agencies' approval process.

- Construction Completion.....March 1997
